Reception

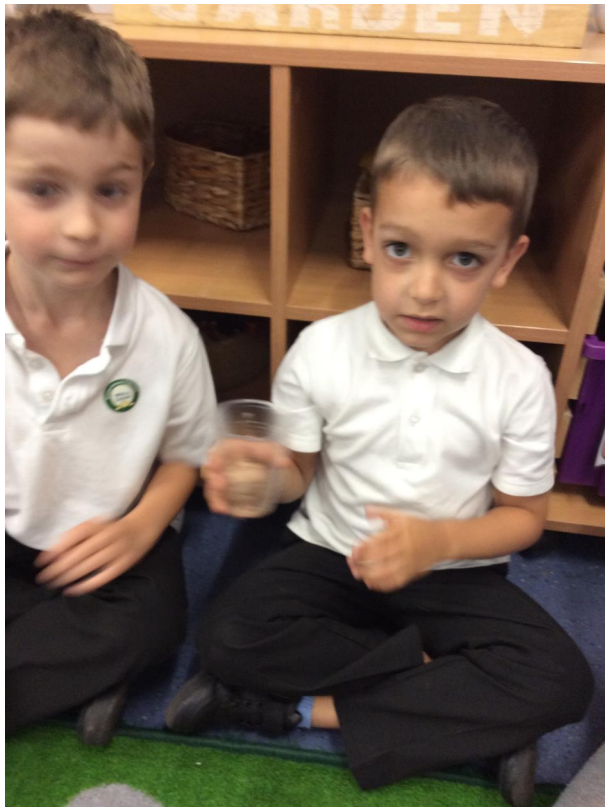
We wish all of our children and families a restful half term and look forward to more learning adventures with them after the break.

was like over 350 years ago. This gave us a great launch pad into our half term's learning and the children have continued to be fascinated by the events of the past.

In English, we have had a key focus around sentence mechanics, spelling and handwriting. The children have been putting in a huge amount of effort and the result has been a great deal of progress already. We can't wait to invite you in to show you our recent independent write about the Great Fire of London and showcase our hard work.

In Maths, we have been doing a lot of learning about understanding place value and developing our addition and subtraction facts. It would be fantastic if you could continue to work on these at home.

We have been working on developing fluency in reading and closing gaps in phonics. The children have been loving reading longer chapter books and are becoming much more independent. Please continue to log the children's home reading on Boom Reader so that they can earn their reading badges. Please ask if you need the login again.

Attendance continues to be vitally important and as a year group this has improved from last year, although we are still only in 4th position in the Year group attendance race! Come on Year 2, we can do it!

Year Three



Year 3 have settled so well into being mature junior children, all staff are super proud of the hard work and commitment they have been demonstrating. In DT this half term we have been considering the role of sauce in a pizza. We explore different textures and types of foods, such as vegetables, sauces, herbs and seasoning to create our own perfect blend of pizza sauce. When we were happy with the taste, texture and appearance of the sauce we used it to top our pitta pizza.

Year Four







Year 4 have had a fantastic first half term. We began our year with our Anglo-Saxon day. The children immersed themselves into the day by dressing up, learning how to write in Saxon runes and re-enacting the invasion of the Angles, Saxons and Jutes to Britain. In addition, this half term, the children have enjoyed reading the stories of Flotsam, I was a Rat and The Creakers. Year 4 have created some fantastic pieces of writing linked to our text I was a R at. Furthermore, the pupils have shown a noticeable increase in motivation towards mastering their multiplication tables. 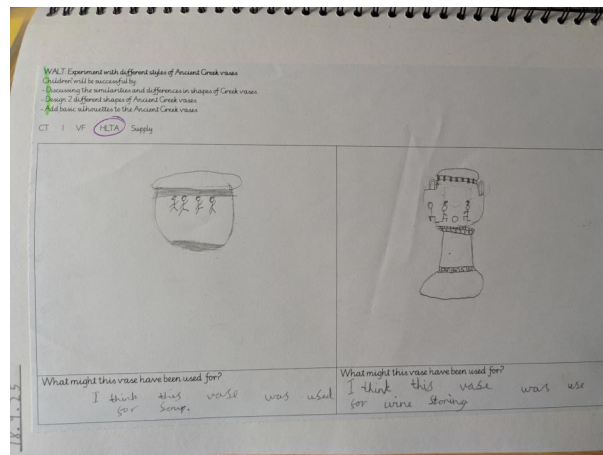
Year Five



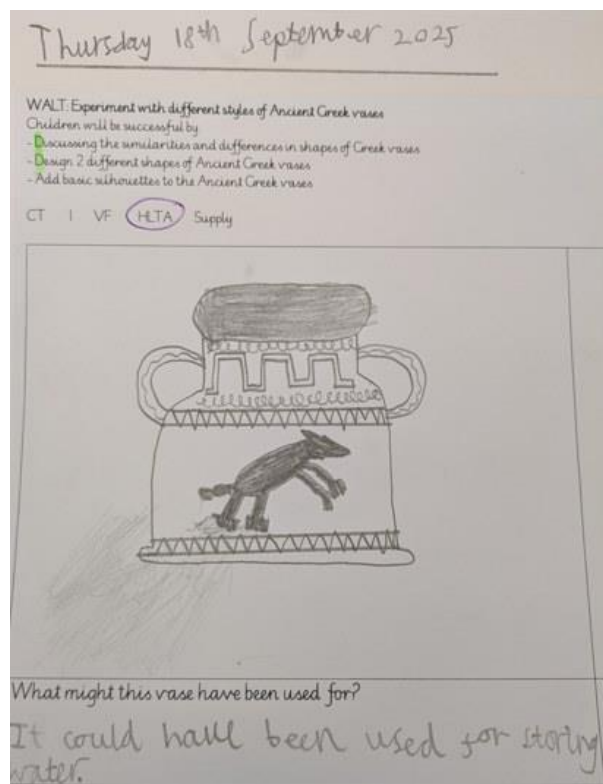

Year 6 have been immersing themselves in a rich and varied curriculum this term.

Through the gripping historical theme of *Crime and Punishment*, pupils have explored how justice has evolved, drawing comparisons between past and present. Their engagement with the novel *Wild Boy* has inspired **sustained pieces of writing**, showcasing their ability to write with depth, empathy, and historical awareness.

In science, children have been learning about the **function of the heart**, brought to life through the use of **VR headsets**, allowing them to explore the circulatory system in an interactive and memorable way.

Maths lessons have focused on developing confidence and fluency in **solving fraction equations**, using a range of methods to deepen understanding. In art, pupils have applied their knowledge of perspective to create **detailed and expressive drawings**, demonstrating growing skill and creativity.

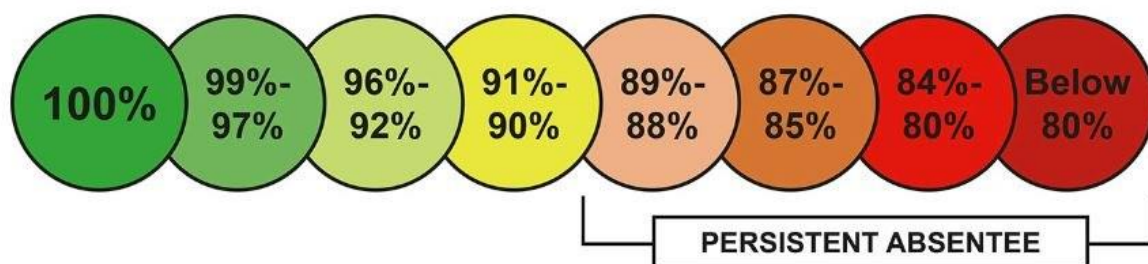
While academic progress is developing, **attendance remains an area for improvement**, and we continue to encourage consistent school attendance to ensure every child benefits fully from these enriching experiences.

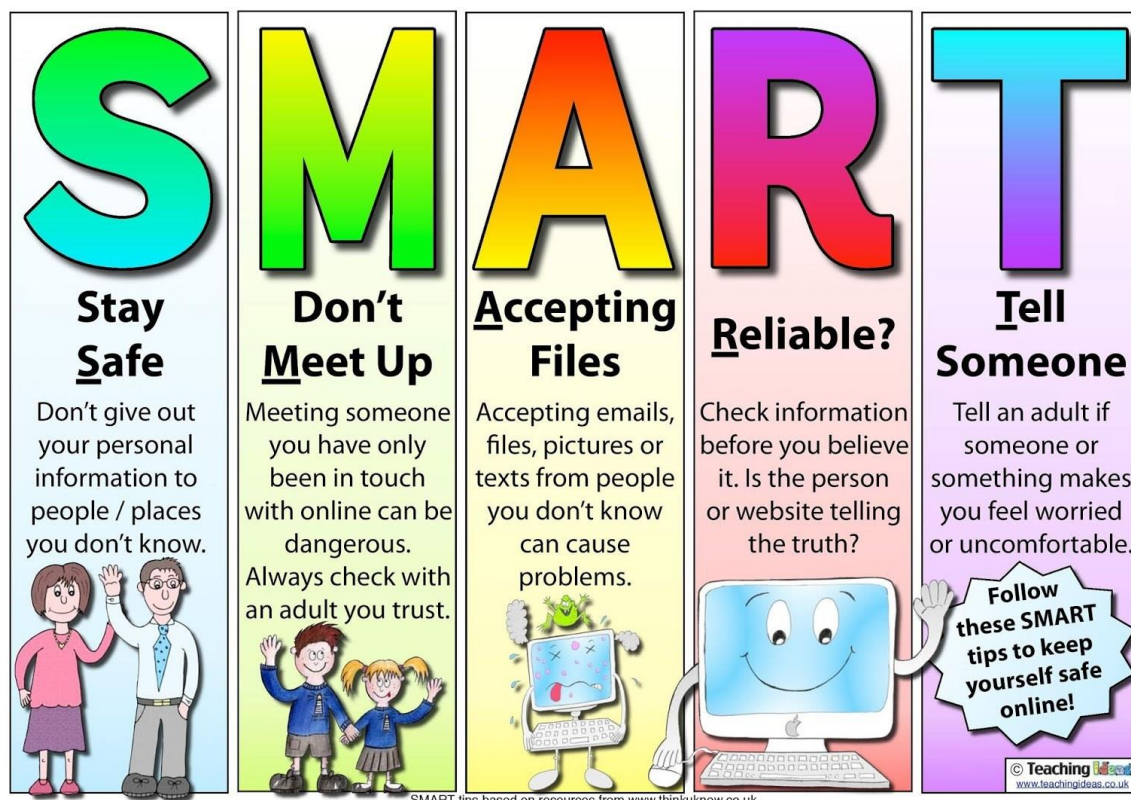

Book review: Mr Osborne

Beetle Boy by M. G. Leonard
