Class 6P winner is Tommy

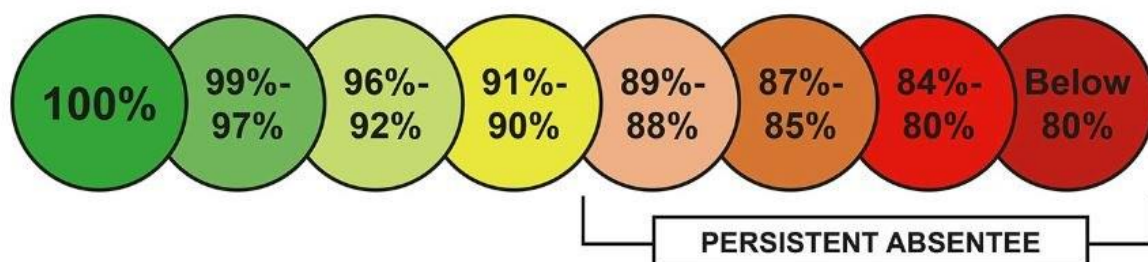
Tommy, you are a star. I have been so impressed with the way you have taken every opportunity offered to you and are using it to make progress. Your effort and contributions are very impressive.
