Class 6P winner is Aila

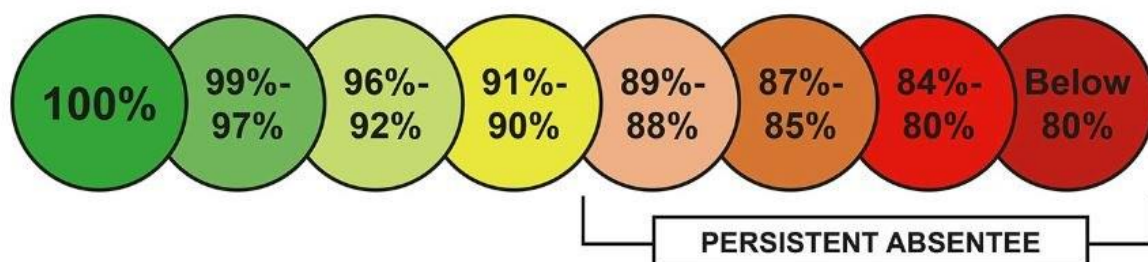
