Class 6P winner is Sam

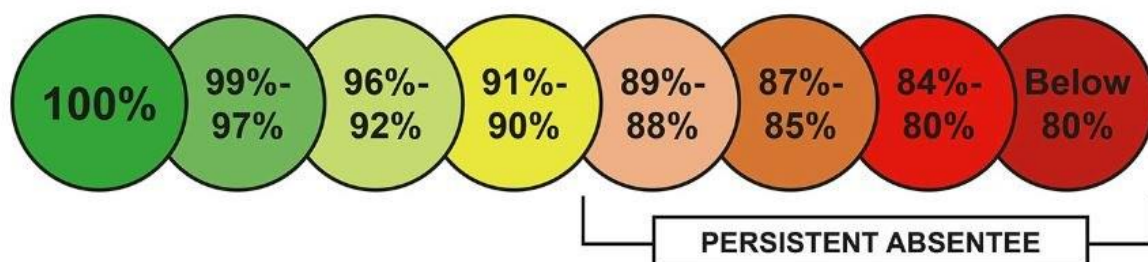
