Year 4 - Francesca really enjoyed our TT rockstars Day. "TT Rockstar Day was really fun because we did times tables and maths all day."

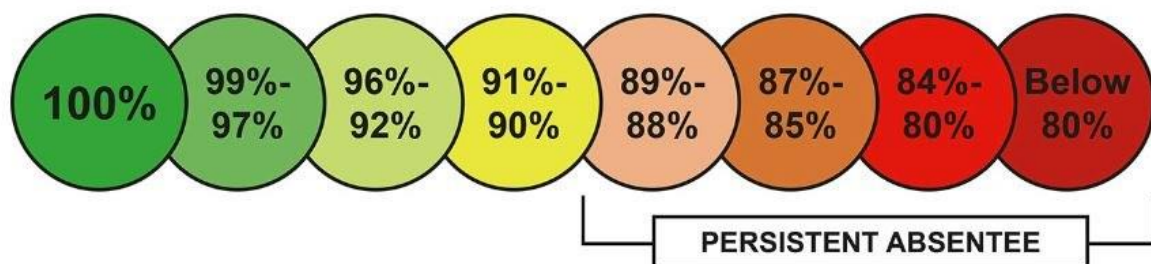
Year 5 - Kyron, "I would like to show appreciation to Blaine for being a good team mate during football at lunchtimes"

Hamwic Education Trust are now consulting on the Infant/Primary Admissions Policy, Southampton Partnerships for 2027 – 2028. The consultation ends on 24th January 2026.

There are no changes to PAN or oversubscription criteria for Weston Shore Infant School or Weston Park Primary School. There is a proposed reduction in PAN to 60 for Glenfield Infant School.
