Class 6P winner is Lacey

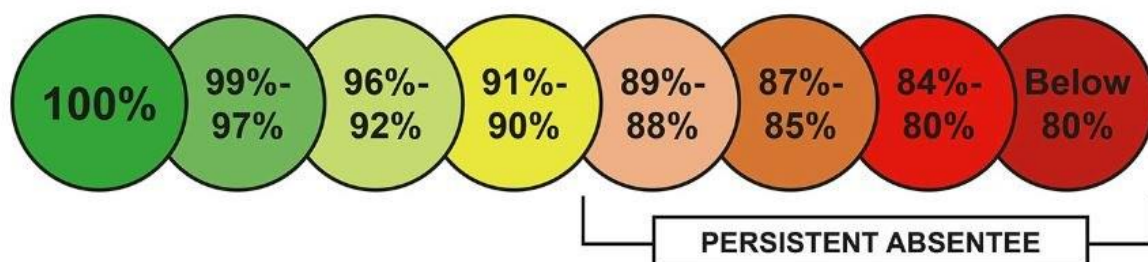
