Year 4 - Miss Cornell would like to show appreciation to Martins for being a fantastic Makaton ambassador and using our learnt Makaton signs within the school day.

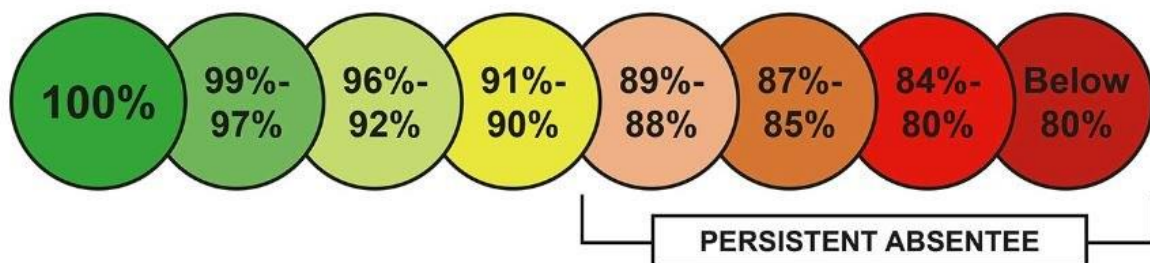
Year 5 - Mrs Hussey, "I want to show appreciation to 5F for an amazing morning of learning on Thursday"

Hamwic Education Trust are now consulting on the Infant/Primary Admissions Policy, Southampton Partnerships for 2027 – 2028. The consultation ends on 24th January 2026. There are no changes to PAN or oversubscription criteria for Weston Shore Infant School or Weston Park Primary School. There is a proposed reduction in PAN to 60 for Glenfield Infant School.
