Year 4 - Elsie - "I appreciate Miss Cornell for being an amazing teacher."


Year 5 - Mason, "I want to show appreciation to Mrs Boston for helping me in class"

There are no changes to PAN or oversubscription criteria for Weston Shore Infant School or Weston Park Primary School. There is a proposed reduction in PAN to 60 for Glenfield Infant School.**
